99.9% of online generators are **time-wasting traps**. Focus your energy on **legit reward paths**.

\$10	Indie games, avatars, add-ons	\$25–\$30 worth of content
\$20	Small bundles, PS Plus 1 month	\$40+
\$50	Full AAA game or 3–4 indie games	\$100+
\$100	Full PS Plus annual + 2 AAA games	\$200+
