How to watch the Australia Wallabies vs. Fiji Rugby. The Rugby will stream on AIR. As the Wallabies prepare to host the Fiji Water Flying Fijians on Sunday, July 6, 2025, at McDonald Jones Stadium in Newcastle, this one-off Test match carries weight far beyond its billing. For Australia, it's the final tune-up before the British & Irish Lions arrive. For Fiji, it's a chance to prove their World Cup triumph over the Wallabies in 2023 was no fluke—and to continue their march toward Tier 1 consistency.

The Stakes

- Wallabies: This is their only warm-up before the Lions series. New head coach Joe Schmidt needs cohesion, confidence, and clarity from his 36-man squad.
- Fiji: Head coach Mick Byrne sees this as the first of ten Tier 1 Tests over two years—a proving ground for a team aiming to peak at the 2027 Rugby World Cup.

Wallabies: Rebuilding with Purpose

Australia's squad blends experience and fresh blood:

- Veterans like James Slipper (143 caps) and Will Skelton anchor the pack.
- New faces include uncapped talents Nick Champion de Crespigny and Corey Toole.
- Key returnees: David Porecki, back in gold after captaining at RWC 2023.

Joe Schmidt's challenge? Forge a cohesive unit from Super Rugby standouts and overseas returnees in just one week of camp.

Flying Fijians: Unity from Diversity

Fiji's preparation has been intense and focused:

- Players arrived from 15 different environments, but Byrne emphasizes unity and energy.
- The squad is riding high after a historic 2023, where they beat England, Wales, and—most memorably—Australia.
- Byrne's goal: "80 high-quality, repeated-effort minutes" against Tier 1 opposition.

Fiji's flair is undeniable, but Australia's structure and set-piece dominance remain potent.

Venue & Kickoff

- Date: Sunday, July 6, 2025
- Time: 1:30 PM AEST
- Venue: McDonald Jones Stadium, Newcastle
- Significance: Only the third Wallabies Test ever held in the Hunter Region.

What to Expect

Expect fireworks. Fiji will bring offloading chaos and fearless running. The Wallabies will counter with tactical kicking, set-piece precision, and a hunger to reclaim pride. This isn't just a warm-up—it's a statement.
